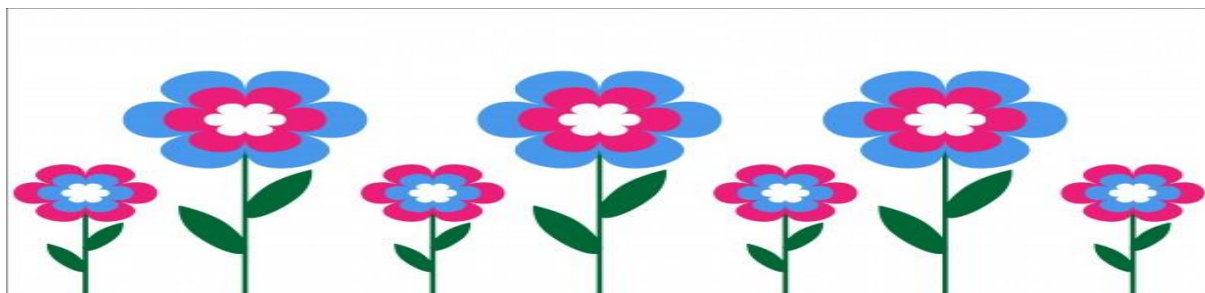
We ask parents to keep in regular contact with the school. In addition, if any family feels that we can support them in anyway during this challenging time please email or call the school.

I would also like to politely remind parents that Key Worker provision needs to be booked by the Thursday morning the week before the provision is needed. This is to ensure that we have a room and staffing available.

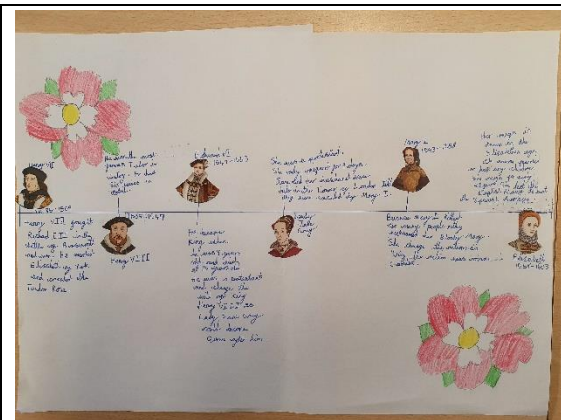
Well done to Jowan who got 5/5 on his spelling test this week.
